

HAYWARD LEAGUE ROUND UP - SATURDAY 29th APRIL 2017

Management duo Mike Artwell and Gary Sims brought the curtain down on their partnership at the helm of Bournemouth Electric's **HAYWARD SATURDAY PREMIER DIVISION** flagship with a 5-1 triumph over AFC Burton to clinch a third place finish.
