James Soulsby was also on target for Sports as they took a 2-0 half time lead but ace marksman Steve Flynn’s second half brace salvaged a point for Priory.

Priory take over on top of the table though as Abbey, the other side who boasted a perfect record, took an unexpected 3-1 tumble against Talbot Rangers. Sam Lanahan struck for Abbey with Rangers getting their first points of the season courtesy of Marcus Cullen and a couple of goals from Mark Pudney.
