

COUNTY CUP ROUND UP - SUNDAY 6th JANUARY 2019

The eagerly awaited **JOHN WARD HAMPSHIRE SENIOR CUP** quarter final between Division One heavyweights Loch & Quay and Talbot Rangers produced a full blooded contest with Loch & Quay coming back from a goal down to win 2-1. Runners up in the competition last season, Rangers took a first half lead courtesy of a Marcus Cullen penalty. The introduction of Shane Sheridan as a second half substitute soon paid dividends for the hosts when he swept home a cross from the left to put them on terms. Sheridan almost had a second soon afterwards when he turned and fired in a shot from close range but Rangers' goalkeeper Nathan Clark denied him with a brilliant reflex save. Clark was beaten for a second time though when Harry Cooper struck to put Loch & Quay in the semi finals.

Vienna Suttoners are in the last eight of the **HAMPSHIRE INTERMEDIATE CUP** after Josh Thompson's 88th minute winner gave them the verdict 4-3 in their fourth round tie against Wickham Dynamos. Matty Chapman-Burnett struck twice for Suttoners with Dave Brown also on target.

Max Wilcock led the way with a hat-trick when **DORSET SUNDAY CHALLENGE CUP** holders Abbey began their defence of the trophy with an 8-1 fourth round triumph over Newtown Athletic. Chris Long (2), Simon Bereznicki, Mark Dykes, and Luke Dawe were the other Abbey marksman while Dan Molyneaux scored the Newtown consolation goal. Nasim Meddah was the five goal star of Wakanda's 14-1 trouncing of Poole Borough with Diego Galusni, Karol Rog, Ali Fakhil, and Kieran Shirley adding two each. Abdulaziz Aldhayan was the other Wakanda scorer with Lewis Armstrong replying for Borough. Sam Thompson and Will Robinson both bagged hat-tricks when Alderney Manor gave Parley Sports a 7-1 drubbing. James King scored the other two Alderney goals with James Soulsby scoring for Parley.
