Manor sweep nearest rivals aside

Timo Glead struck for second placed Bisterne United but hundred per cent Bournemouth Manor opened an eight-point lead at the top of the **HAYWARD SATURDAY PREMIER DIVISION** after sweeping them aside 4-1 thanks to Shane Barney, Martin Sault, and a couple of goals from ace marksman Terry Foote.
