TREBLE TROPHY SUCCESS FOR KRAKEN

With the BDFA Camerons Cup and the Division One title already in the bag, Kraken Sports collected their third trophy in eleven days when they retained the DORSET SUNDAY CHALLENGE CUP with a 5-2 victory over Ferndown Town at the County Ground.



Fourth Division Ferndown, in their first season in the Bournemouth League, deserve a lot of credit for the contribution they made to the game, particularly Mitch Hack and goalkeeper Eddie Jenner.

The Ferndown stopper made an excellent save in the 22nd minute to keep out a close range header from Kraken skipper Richard Fieldhouse but he was powerless to prevent Ocean Smith giving Kraken the lead three minutes later with a shot that took deflection which caused it to loop over the 'keeper.

Kraken doubled their lead after 34 minutes when Max Wilcock broke away down the left to find the far corner of the net with a clinical finish but the Ferndown 'keeper got down well three minutes later to save Wilcock's low strike.

Kraken added a third on the stroke of half time when the Ferndown defence were unable to clear a cross from the left and Dan Naish volleyed the ball home.



Ferndown pulled one back two minutes into the second half when they played the ball up to Finley Girdler who slotted it past Felix Bruce in the Kraken goal.

Kraken's three goal lead was restored in the 70th minute when Max Wilcock took the ball past the 'keeper to slot it home. Eddie Jenner pulled off another superb save to deny Connor Doe in the 84th minute and Ferndown nabbed a second goal a minute from time when Liam Cullen curled the ball in from out on the left.

Kraken had the last word though, five minutes into stoppage time with the last kick of the match. Max Wilcock played the ball inside to Ocean Smith who volleyed it home.
