Sam Lane struck for Parkstone Athletic but New Milton Borough overpowered them 5-1 thanks to Deano Bashford, Stephen Murphy, Sam Share, and a couple of goals from Tyler Dale. Upton Sociedad were also 5-1 winners when they scuppered Parkstone with Jamie Cooper and Ben Lees scoring two each and Ryan Masson also getting on the score sheet.
